MINOR IN CREATIVE WRITING

A minor in Creative Writing gives students a chance to make art — poems, stories, works for performance — out of words, and also to consider literature from a maker's perspective.

Our creative writing minors come from all over the university: some major in English;* some major in other disciplines, entirely. What brings our students together is an experience of the vitality of both written and spoken word.

Students who declare a Minor in Creative Writing must take:

- at least twelve (12) credit hours in Creative Writing, in more than one genre**
- twelve (12) credit hours more in English courses beyond the first year level***
- * Students who wish to major in English and minor in Creative Writing must take forty-eight (48) credit hours in English courses above three (3) credit hours in ENGL at the 1000-level and fulfill the requirements of both programs.
