BLUENOSE HEALTH GENDER AFFIRMING CARE CLINIC



Bluenose Health is a subscription-based, nurse practitioner-led primary care clinic in Halifax, offering accessible and inclusive medical support tailored to the needs of queer and trans communities. With a personalized, patient-centred approach, Bluenose Health helps bridge gaps in the public healthcare system by providing timely, compassionate care that respects both dignity and autonomy.

The clinic offers a broad spectrum of gender-affirming and primary healthcare services - including hormone replacement therapy, surgical readiness and aftercare letters. They offer STI testing and treatment, PrEP, PEP, mental health support, and referrals to counselling. Bluenose Health also provides minor surgeries and joint injections, ensuring that gender-diverse patients can access affirming care in one trusted setting.

HSHC is a nonprofit community clinic that provides inclusive, confidential, and sex-positive healthcare for people across Halifax and Nova Scotia. With a commitment to equity and accessibility, HSHC is a trusted resource for queer and trans communities seeking affirming care. The centre is grounded in values of respect, dignity, and client choice, ensuring that everyone who walks through its doors is met without stigma or judgment.

HSHC offers a wide range of services, including sexual and reproductive healthcare, gender-affirming support, and harm reduction resources. Clients can access STI testing, contraception, pregnancy options, and PrEP, alongside specialized services such as hormone therapy support, surgical referrals, and post-operative care.

HEALTH EQUITY ALLIANCE NS



Health Equity Alliance of Nova Scotia (HEAL NS) is a dedicated organization that provides comprehensive support and advocacy for individuals living with HIV/AIDS. Their services are designed to meet the diverse needs of the gueer and trans communities in Nova Scotia, focusing on harm reduction, health literacy, and wellness

HEAL NS offers a range of educational workshops and outreach programming to increase awareness of HIV transmission, prevention, and care. Among their primary services is system navigation and support.

Individuals can access free HIV self-test kits, which provide a private and accessible way to monitor one's health status. Their tests are through a NS Health program called STI Care Now, and people can access Chlamydia and Gonorrhea tests, as well as HIV tests through the program. IWK GENDER AFFIRMING CARE



IWK GAC is a specialized program within the IWK Health Centre that supports 2SLGBTQIA+ youth across Nova Scotia. The program provides affirming and confidential care tailored to the unique needs of young people exploring their gender identity, helping them access medical, social, and emotional supports in a safe environment.

Services include guidance on gender identity exploration, readiness assessments for medical interventions, and information about the benefits and risks of different treatments.

Their program also supports youth with hormone therapy, surgical referrals, working closely with families and healthcare providers to ensure holistic, youth-centered support.

The Nova Scotia Department of Health and Wellness is responsible for overseeing the province's healthcare system and plays an important role in advancing equity through access to gender-affirming care. As part of its mandate, the department funds a range of gender-affirming surgeries under Medical Services Insurance (MSI), reflecting its commitment to inclusive and accessible healthcare for trans and gender-diverse communities.

Coverage includes procedures available within Nova Scotia as well as surgeries performed out of province at specialized clinics such as GrS Montreal. In addition, the department supports related services like hormone therapy, surgical referrals, and post-operative care.

PRIDEHEALTH



Pride Health is a partnership between Nova Scotia Health and IWK Health that works to improve access to safe, inclusive, and affirming care for 2SLGBTQIA+ communities across the province. The program helps people connect to services such as genderaffirming care, sexually transmitted and blood-borne infection (STBBI) testing, fertility and reproductive health, mental health supports, and community programs.

Alongside direct support, prideHealth offers training, consultation, and educational resources to reduce barriers and promote equity within healthcare settings. The program also organizes learning opportunities, such as the Affirming Care Conference, and provides practical tools to help individuals navigate hormone therapy, legal transition, and gender-affirming surgery in Nova Scotia.

LET ME BE ME: A LEGAL INFORMATION GUIDE TO CANADA'S CONVERSION THERAPY* BAN



In 2022, Canada added new provisions to our Criminal Code that address the widely discredited and harmful practice of conversion therapy*. Conversion therapy* is a practice that is intended to change a person's sexual orientation, gender identity, or gender expression to heterosexual and/or cisgender.

Conversion therapy* is rooted in homophobic and transphobic ideas about acceptable behaviours and identities.

This new legislation came into force on January 7, 2022 and makes it illegal in Canada to provide, promote, or profit from the practice of conversion therapy.*

This guide is intended to help you understand what conversion therapy* is and is not, what its impacts are on the health and wellbeing of 2SLGBTQIA+ communities, and what these new laws mean for people across our country.

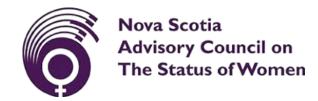

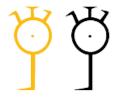

The Wabanaki Two-Spirit Alliance (W2SA) is a volunteer-led organization composed of researchers, academics, knowledge holders, youth, Elder Two-Spirits, and allies. The alliance focuses on supporting the well-being of Two-Spirit and Indigenous 2SLGBTQIA+individuals and communities within Wabanaki Territory, which includes Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, Newfoundland and Labrador, the Gaspé region of Quebec, and northern areas of Maine.

The alliance's mission is to represent the emotional, spiritual, mental, and physical health of Two-Spirit and Indigenous LGBTQ+ people, guided by the beliefs and values within the Peace and Friendship Treaty framework. W2SA provides cultural guidance, community connections, advocacy, and support for initiatives that promote safety, wellness, and recognition of Two-Spirit identities across Wabanaki Territory.

All Genders Helpline is a free and confidential service offered by Family Service Nova Scotia for adults of all genders, including non-binary and trans individuals, who have concerns about their well-being, safety, or the safety of others. The service supports people in navigating personal challenges, helping them access the guidance, resources, and referrals they need.

Callers can connect with trained professionals who provide information, navigation, referrals, and brief intervention counselling tailored to their unique circumstances. The helpline operates 24 hours a day through 2-1-1, with toll-free access at 1-855-466-4994 when 2-1-1 is not available. While it is not a crisis line, individuals experiencing a crisis are directed to the 24-Hour Provincial Crisis Line at 1-888-429-8167 or are advised to call 9-1-1 for immediate support.

EATING DISORDERS NOVA SCOTIA



Eating Disorders Nova Scotia offers a virtual peer support group specifically for trans and non-binary individuals who are navigating concerns related to food, body image, and gender dysphoria. The program provides a confidential and inclusive space for participants to discuss personal challenges, share experiences, and explore strategies for self-care and emotional well-being.

Sessions focus on a variety of topics including self-compassion, unlearning gender binaries, coping with societal pressures, and addressing the intersections of gender identity and body image. The group is facilitated by two peer mentors who identify as trans and non-binary, providing guidance and support from an affirming perspective and fostering connections among participants to help build resilience and community.

MOVING FORWARD FAMILY SERVICES SOCIETY



Moving Forward Family Services Society is a non-profit organization that offers free short-term and affordable long-term counselling for individuals who cannot access private therapy or face long wait times for public services. The organization also provides free psychoeducational coaching programs designed to support mental health and personal growth.

Counselling services are offered virtually - either online or over the phone - for people living in Nova Scotia and cover a range of topics including depression and anxiety, substance use, couples and family conflict, trauma, grief and loss, identity and sexuality, stress, and anger. The phone line is available at all times, with calls returned within 24 hours, and online sessions are typically offered Monday to Friday from 1:00 pm to 9:00 pm on a pay-what-you-can basis.

They came together in early 2022 and are guided by anti-oppressive, anti-racist, intersectional approaches that acknowledge the detrimental effects that structural oppression and systemic discrimination have on our community's mental health, as well as the impacts these have on access to sexual and gender-diverse care.
