A first for Atlantic Canada, the full-time Sobey EDBA brings the possibility of development and support for senior leaders using evidence-based approaches to conduct practice-oriented research. Designed for seasoned executives, the program offers an impressive credential that will not only distinguish their value in the job market but also reward them with critical knowledge and skills to succeed in today's complex business environment.

- EDBAs are distinct from PhD-style programs, focused on both academic rigour and knowledge transfer/mobilization.
- EDBA graduates learn an evidence-based approach that applies a problem-solving framework to overcome assumptions and ground analysis in objective criteria.
- The EDBA educates business and organizational leaders to create, conduct, and disseminate applied research to their organization, industry sector, profession, and/or government policy.

Sobey School is one of a select group of schools designated as PRME Champions in the Principles for Responsible Management Education initiative by the United Nations.

Program details

Students can complete the program in three years, with two years of coursework followed by a semester of courses with an experiential learning foundation, and then two semesters to complete an applied research project (dissertation).

Experienced instructors create dynamic learning environments by delivering quality classes remotely. The program is delivered in four modules over three years in a hybrid format. Candidates will be on-site three times a year (for three days each time), with all other participation completed online.

Students must successfully complete 11 courses (33 credit hours), including a DBA dissertation.

In addition to course work, students must complete three significant projects to advance to the next year of study.

- Year 1: Conduct a mini REA and problem statement.
- Year 2: Develop an Applied Research Project proposal and successfully defend it to a three-member faculty committee.
- Year 3: Conduct and defend a DBA dissertation

Required courses include:

- Translating knowledge
- Synthesizing research evidence
- Diagnosing problems and generating options
- · Developing an applied research proposal



Admissions

Admission requirements

- An MBA degree or equivalent master-level degree (eg., Master of Public Administration) with a minimum GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.3 scale) or GMAT as appropriate.
- We prefer a candidate to have approximately 15 years of senior managerial and/or executive work experience.
- If your first language is not English, you must submit an official TOEFL iBT® or IELTS. Tests cannot be more than two years old. We require an overall IELTS score of 7.0 with no band below 6.5.
- · You must provide a letter of intent and be available for an interview if required.

Application deadlines

Applications must be submitted by May 1 of intake year (or later if space allows).


